 We are the membership and awarding body for environmental health – supporting about 7,500 members across the public, private and third sector


- We are leaders we're shaping the future of environmental health by putting members at the heart of the debate, raising the profile of environmental health careers, and campaigning and working with government on key issues





Noise: CIEH Policy Activity



- Members of our Environmental Protection Advisory Panel gave oral evidence on noise pollution to the House of Lords Science and Technology committee
- Published guidance on decision making processes to be considered during planning
- Worked with Institute of Acoustics (IoA) on two briefing notes mitigating the potential noise impacts of heat pumps
- Worked with IoA on Gym Acoustics Guidance
- Worked with national press
- Joining the dots between noise and mental health
- Currently working on noise guidance in the entertainment sector looking at Noise as health and safety and Env issue
- EP panel members gave evidence to the climate change, environment and infrastructure at the Senedd well as Environmental impacts
- Responded to Welsh noise and soundscape consultation





Challenges

- Societal changes and erosion of community leading to an increase in nuisance complaints


